Degree College for Women Muzaffargarh and degree classes were started. The College is spread over 49 canal of land. The City Muzaffargarh

Muzaffargarh city is the capital of district Muzaffargarh. It lies on the bank of the Chenab River. Muzaffargarh was founded in 1794 by the Governor of Multan Nawab Muzaffar Khan. The Meaning of Muzaffargarh is "Fort of Muzaffar" because the old town lies inside the walls of a fort built by Nawab Muzaffar Khan of Multan. In 1861 it became the headquarters of Muzaffargarh District.

Muzaffargarh spreads over an area of 8,249 km² and forms a strip between the Chenab River on its east and Indus River on its west, which pass along the Eastern and Western boundaries respectively of the districts and a triangle at Alipur Tehsil of the district.

The city of Muzaffargarh is located in southern Punjab province at almost the exact center of Pakistan. The closest major city is Multan. The area around the city is a flat, alluvial plain and is ideal for agriculture, with many citrus, dates and mango farms. There are many canals that cut across the Muzaffargarh District, providing water to nearby farms. This makes the land very fertile. The city known for private education system and almost 500 to 600 private schools are registered under the Punjab Education Foundation (PEF).




Accommodation/Hostel



- 1. All the students will attend a class of Holy Quran with translation of 1 Hour in a week and have to qualify by securing 50 marks out of 100 in every semester.
- 2. For Practical Learning Requirement, every student shall take part in tutorial activities (Sports club, dramatic societies, declamation societies, blood donor societies etc.) for minimum ol'4 hours per week lor two semesters and completion of such activities will be endorsed by the certification l'rom the concerned Principal/HoD/Chairmar/Director.
- 3. Every student shall have to complete and quality Internship of at least 9 weeks before the completion of Associate / BS degree.
- 4. There will be 50 marks for writing the Internship report and 50 marks will be reserved for the Internship viva voce. Moreover, the qualifying marks for Non-credit Internship will be 50 out of 100 marks.
- 5. A student admitted to the Associate Degree program after passing out first four semesters with the qualifying condition of Internship can get admission in the relevant/ other BS Programs provided that if the student meets the admission criteria of the concerned Department institute School/College.

- 1. The courses u,ith codes *EWRT 101", "EWRT 102" & "EWRT 201" can be taught by the teachers having tenninal degree in the subject of English.
- 2. The courses with codes "QREA 107" & "QREA 108" can be taught by the teachers having terminal degree in the subjects of Economics, Mathematics & Statistics.

- 8. Disciplinary action by the Principal of a College against the student(s) may be taken in the following forms depending upon the severity of the offence:
- i. A student may be fined.
- ii. A student may be placed on probation for a fixed period.
- iii. If during the period of probation, she fails to improve her conduct, she may be rusticated or expelled.
- 9. Whenever rustication imposed on a College student, shall always mean the loss of one academic year in so far as her Examination are concerned. The period of absence from the College will, however, depend upon the time of the year when the penalty is imposed. The student under rustication may at the discretion of the Principal of the College be permitted to rejoin the class in the same College in the beginning of the next academic year.
- 10. A rusticated student once re-admitted and again found creating disturbance/ indiscipline, etc. will be expelled from the college.


